Continuous evaluation: In addition to the seminars, the student also completes the practical part of the clinic carried out either as part of an internship in the civic association League for Human Rights, or via other practical activities under the supervision of the teacher.						
Interim evaluation: written elaboration of the assignment. The evaluation consists in drafting and submitting a legal application (writing an administrative decision or an administrative action). Evaluation: A: 100%-91%, B: 90%-81%, C: 80%-71%, D: 70%-66%, E: 65%-60%, FX: 59%-0%.

Learning outcomes:						
By completing the course the student will master the basics of migration law, identify relevant international agreements, explain selected issues of European Union law, Slovak legislation based on work with international, European and national legislation, personal participation in court proceedings in foreign and asylum matters, can analyze and critically evaluate their course, take their own, professionally argued opinion and present it orally and in writing and detects, searches and analyzes the case law of the Supreme Court of the Slovak Republic, the case law of the European Court of Human Rights and the Court of Justice of the European Union. They can determine the basic settings of migration policies, whether immigration policies, asylum or return policies and on the basis of visits and communication with representatives of the International Organization for Migration (IOM), or obtaining basic information about the Office of the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees (UNHCR) they can identify their system of work, reproduce their basic objectives and discuss the facts. The student seeks relevant information about countries of origin to serve as evidence in asylum or foreigner proceedings. They are able to identify the situation and position of a foreigner, prepare the basic framework for providing legal advice and assistance to foreigners.
