Continuous evaluation: Final evaluation: Written exam (total 50 points), which consists of a combination of test questions (3 test questions with 5 possible answers each - 15 pts), open-ended questions (2 questions - 20 points) and case studies (15 points). The test questions aim to determine the ability to understand the text and legal terminology, the open-ended questions aim to demonstrate the ability to master theoretical knowledge and the study case shows the ability to apply theoretical knowledge in a practical situation, to which students are led during the teaching part of the semester. Information and materials for preparing for the exam are published in Moodle. Evaluation: A: 50 – 47, B: 46.5 – 44, C: 43.5 – 41, D: 40.5 – 38, E: 37.5 - 35, FX: 34.5 – 0. Finished: By exam.			
Learning outcomes: After completing the course European Substantive Law, the student will be able to explain the application of European Union law through national judicial and law enforcement agencies, identify the freedoms of the European Union internal market and assess compliance of national legislation with the principles of the internal market, explain the various types of proceedings before the Court and use them to address specific situations, identify and analyse commercial practices that result in distortions of competition and classify the gravity of the infringements, make a legal characterization of the subject matter, including judgments of the Court of Justice of the European Union and apply them to similar legal relationships; Of the Court of Justice of the European Union in the database of judicial decisions and to apply settled case law to similar facts, to critically analyse, interpret and apply European Union law and to identify situations in which the standards of the European Union in the implementation of legal relations, communicate and legally argue their own considerations and solutions to specific situations.
