Method of evaluation: Completion by a continuing assessment			
Continuous evaluation: The course is continuously evaluated and the evaluation consists of the students obligation to individually prepare at least 2 assignment. Ongoing evaluation: The course is continuously evaluated and the student is obliged to submit at least two assignments during the semester by the 9th week. The argumentation used, the work with legal regulations, the complexity of grasping the problem, structure of the text and its formalities are evaluated. Maximum score for the two assignments is 100. Evaluation: A: 100 – 91, B: 90 – 81, C: 80 – 71, D: 70 – 61, E: 60 – 51 points, FX: 50 points and less.			
Final evaluation: Completion by a continuing assessment Finished: By ongoing evaluation.			
Learning outcomes: By completing the course the student will gain the ability to draft several different types of legal documents and submissions (lawsuit, resolution, application of a claim for bankruptcy proceedings, proposal for entry in the commercial register, partnership agreement). As part of the work on these assignments, the student will critically evaluate the presented factual situation, learn to comprehensively analyze the case and find applicable legal norms to the case, thanks to which they will practice the process of subsumption. When designing the text of the assignment, they will deepen their abilities of legal argumentation, logical construction of the text, stylization and formal editing of the text. In solving case studies, the output of which is not a legal submission, the student will learn and deepen the ability to think synthetically and build the most convincing line of legal arguments for the side of the simulated case whose interests they defend. Students will work in solving some case studies in groups, which will develop their expression and communication skills, as well as the basics of systematic work on a joint assignment in a group of several researchers. Within the confrontation of their own arguments with the arguments of the students of the second group, the student will gain the ability to react quickly, to promptly navigate in the problem, as well as in the applied legal regulation.
