Final evaluation: Final examination: successful completion of a written exam consisting of 9 test questions and 1 open-ended question, with the student choosing one correct answer for each of the test questions providing the options: a, b, c. The student gets 1 point for each correct answer (maximum score for test questions is 9). A student can get a maximum of 3 points for an open-ended question. Evaluation scale: 12-11 points: A, 10 points: B, 9 points: C, 8 points: D, 7 points: E, 6 points and less: FX. Finished: By exam.					
Learning outcomes: After completing the course, the student will gain knowledge to be able to identify and understand concepts related to remedies, non-dispute proceedings, administrative judiciary, execution proceedings and arbitration proceedings. They will know the system of civil proceedings in the context of other proceedings (out-of-court proceedings, administrative judiciary, execution proceedings, and arbitration proceedings) and will be able to analyse problems in the topics taught and present their own opinion on these issues. The student will also be able to apply knowledge of the professional ethics of a lawyer, the executory profession and the position of an arbitrator. They will have communication skills, including effective listening and critical reading. They will learn to create written as well as oral argumentation, and justify the proposed solution to the problem. Finally, they will be able to lead, organize and conduct legal assessments as well as compile the necessary legal documents.

Enforcement of the decision in matters of minors. 6. Proceedings in certain status matters of natural persons. 7. Administrative judiciary, disciplinary proceedings in the legal professions and their judicial review. 8. Enforcement proceedings in general - the course of execution proceedings. 9. Foreclosure by deductions from wages and other income, execution by ordering a claim. 10. Foreclosure by sale of movable property. Foreclosure by sale of real estate. 11.
