Continuous evaluation: The course ends with an ongoing evaluation in the form of a written presentation of the doctoral student, which he/she prepares on the basic topics of this course, which are mainly the material and formal understanding of crime, institutes of restorative justice in criminal law and revision of decisions in criminal proceedings. In his/her presentation, the doctoral student must demonstrate the ability to find and creatively analyze partial problems associated with the areas in question and be able to link the knowledge of substantive criminal law with procedural law. Final evaluation: Completion by a continuing assessment Finished: By continuous assessment.					
Learning outcomes: By completing the course the student will gain: - orientation in current issues of criminal substantive and procedural law - ability to identify criminal law contexts of the topic of his dissertation, - deepening his capacity for scientific creative work.					
Schedule of subject: The course focuses on those topics that are most discussed in the current scientific literature. In the introduction, the lecturer introduces the matter of the selected problem, presents the basic doctrinal positions and identifies argumentative collusions. Subsequently, in dialogue with students, he will look for connections between the presented theoretical and legal problem and the topics of their dissertations. Basic thematic areas: - material and formal understanding of the crime - institutes of restorative justice in criminal law - institutes for the review of decisions in criminal proceedings.
