Conditions for passing the course: Method of evaluation: Completion by taking an examination			
Continuous evaluation: Final evaluation: During the semester, students' activity in the class (verification of knowledge, asking questions, presenting opinions) will be evaluated, for which they will be able to obtain 25 points (25 % of the total evaluation). Students will present selected case studies (specific cases and their assessment and evaluation, in case of disputes - arguments of individual parties, interconnection to theoretical aspects), for which they will be able to obtain 35 points (30 % of the total evaluation) and prepare a case study for which they will be able to get 45 points (45 %). In total, the student can get 100 points. To obtain a score A (excellent) student must obtain at least 92 points, to obtain a B - at least 84 points, to obtain a C - at least 76 points, to obtain a D - min. 68 points, to obtain an E - at least 60 points. In case the student gets 59 points or less, they will be given a grade FX, i.e. he / she will not be granted credits for the course in question. Finished: By exam.			
Learning outcomes: After successful completion of the course, students will be able to explain the concept of territory, citizenship and nationality in international law, search for and apply relevant sources of international law to the given factual situation, name and characterize foreign bodies for international relations, define international law of armed conflicts, international humanitarian law and international criminal law, compare the scope and functions of selected international intergovernmental organizations and NGOs, present the acquired knowledge and skills to the audience, analyze and critically evaluate existing or fictitious case studies and take the own position on them and present it orally and in writing.
