Conditions for passing the course: Method of evaluation: Completion by a continuing assessment Continuous evaluation: The course is completed with a continuous assessment, which consists of the student's obligation to submit at least three assignments during the semester. The used argumentation, work with legal regulations, complexity of understanding the problem, text construction and formal aspect are assessed. The maximum number of points for two assignments is 100. Assessment: A: 100 – 91, B: 90 – 81, C: 80 – 71, D: 70 – 61, E: 60 – 51 points, FX: 50 points and less. Final evaluation: Completion by a continuing assessment Finished: By ongoing evaluation.					
Learning outcomes: By completing the course, the student will gain the ability to draft several different types of legal documents and submissions (trade registration, proposal for entry in the commercial register, partnership agreement, complaint about delays, resolution). As part of working on these assignments, the student will critically evaluate the presented facts, learn to comprehensively analyze the case and find legal norms applicable to the case, thanks to which he will practice the process of subsumption. When solving case studies, the output of which is not a legal submission, the student will learn and deepen the ability to think synthetically and build the most convincing line of legal arguments for the side of the simulated case whose interests he is defending. Students will work on solving some case studies in groups, which will develop their expression and communication skills, as well as the basics of systematic work on a joint assignment in a group of several solvers. By confronting their own arguments with those of the students in the second group, the student will gain the ability to respond quickly and to promptly orient themselves in the problem, as well as in the applied legal regulation.
