Learning outcomes: The aim of this course is connection between theoretical knowledge and gained practical skills in area of fundamental rights and freedoms protection. Students should be able to apply gained knowledge to concrete practical cases of fundamental rights violation. Also, students should be able to evaluate and to justify arguments in context of fundamental rights and freedoms violation in individual cases. Clinic reflects fundamental rights and freedoms protection, mostly in area of Slovak republic through the Public defender of rights activities. However, we have to use cases of the European court of human rights to strengthen our argumentation techniques. Each lesson will be focused on concrete cases of fundamental rights and freedoms protection in scope of Public defender of rights activities and on relevant cases of the European court of human rights. Students will gain knowledge and skills to identify fundamental rights and freedoms violation in individual cases and will practice argumentation techniques behalf fundamental rights and freedoms protection.
