Continuous evaluation: Final evaluation: Final evaluation: combined form of examination: a) written test, b) oral examination. The written part of the exam consists of a test formed by 50 statements, the truth of which the student evaluates by marking the options - true / false. The evaluation scale for awarding the grade from the test is as follows: A = 50 – 46 pts; B = 45 – 42 pts; C = 41 – 38 pts; D = 37 – 34 pts; E = 33 – 30 pts; FX = 29 – 0 pts. Only a student who has obtained a grade better than FX can take the oral exam. The student who received the FX grade failed the exam as a whole. The oral part of the exam consists of a random selection of 5 statements from the completed test. The student's task is to explain why they consider the chosen statement to be / not to be true. In order for a student to pass the oral part of the exam, they must prove the basic knowledge contained in the compulsory study sources and in the interpretation of the material realized in lectures and seminars from the course Constitutional Law I. If the student fails the oral part of the exam (fails to properly substantiate the (non)truthfulness of the statement), their final grade from the exam as a whole will be FX. If they pass, the examiner will base the final grade on the result obtained in the written test. Finished: By exam.			
Learning outcomes: After completing the course Constitutional Law II, the student is able to identify basic concepts in matters of division of power and apply basic knowledge about the position and mutual relations of the highest public authorities. The student is able to assess and analyse the basic instruments/issues/principles in the norms of constitutional procedural law (Rules of Procedure of the National Council of the Slovak Republic, the Constitutional Court Act) as well as justify and assess the action of some state bodies as (non)compliant with the law. The student is able to classify, apply and communicate the results of normative and decision-making activities of the relevant state authorities with an emphasis on the protection of fundamental rights and freedoms.
