Learning outcomes: The main goal of legal studies is to educate students in law as an scientific discipline. Besides this aim, the law studies should also prepare students for various legal professions e.g. an attorney profession. The objective of this course is to introduce the purpose of advocacy, to explain what it is and demonstrate how legal services are provided. It should also acquaint students with law practice so that they are able to apply the skills and gained knowledge independently in real life circumstances mainly in the field of law. Simply said, the course aim is to simulate the situation when the client approaches the attorney and asks for a legal representation. The attorney has to determine appropriate and applicable processes provided by the legal system. Upon completion student should be able to prepare basic filings and obligation law documents, he/she should be able to apply legal processes regarding conclusion of a contract.					
Schedule of subject: Course is held in a form of seminar and it's underpinned by practice in attorney's office. Course starts with the introduction to advocacy and legal services rendering and describes how the advocacy is performed. It outlines the relationship between an attorney and the client as well as with other attorneys. It also teaches about fundamental rights and obligations in regard to the advocacy practice.
