Conditions for passing the course: Method of evaluation: Completion by taking an examination Continuous evaluation: Final evaluation: The condition for successful completion of the course is passing the exam, which consists of a written part during the teaching period and an oral exam during the examination period. Final evaluation: The exam, which will consist of two parts: (1) Elaboration of a practical assignment containing a specific output for solving a specific factual situation with its justification, which the student submits on a predetermined date during the teaching period (50 % of the final grade - 50 points); (2) Oral exam (student answers 1 randomly selected question from pre-published list of questions - 50 % of the final grade - 50 points). Evaluation scale: 100-91 pts. - A, 90-81 pts. - B, 80-71 pts. - C, 70-61 pts. - D, 60-51 pts. - E, 50 pts. and less - FX. Finished: By exam.			
Learning outcomes: The student who completes the course will gain the ability to interpret and react to complex issues in bankruptcy and restructuring proceedings. They will also be able to identify and understand key concepts in substantive law, legal theory and in the procedural process in the context of domestic and international legal contexts. After completing the course, the student will have the ability to apply knowledge of professional ethics to client representation, judicial and other legal practice. By completing the course the student will improve their communication skills, including effective listening and critical reading, the creation of justified written and oral speeches, conduct, organize and carry out a legal assessment as well as to compile the necessary legal documents in order to be able to adequately solve the problem. The student will be able to show professional judgment and professionalism through negotiations in accordance with the values and standards of the legal profession.
