Learning outcomes: The aim of the course is to build on the knowledge gained in the previous courses, especially in the field of labour law and European law and to deepen them with an international and European aspect. After completing the course, the student is able to explain intersectionally the issue of the studied field, identify sources of international and national labour law, including case law, and creatively apply the acquired knowledge in solving problem tasks. By mastering the basic sources, the student acquires the skill to look for them and then further educate themselves in the subject.
