In the essay on the scope of one standard page (1 standard page includes 1,800 characters, including spaces), the student presents their own arguments on the given topic and the possibilities of its solution; - 75 % - a written review as part of the mid-term evaluation will be the elaboration of a practical example assignment with one main question and 9 partial questions. Each question is evaluated by one point. The questions are related among each other and the student has the related legislation at their disposal. At least 6 out of 10 questions must be answered to successfully complete the final evaluation. Evaluation: A: 100-92; B: 91-84; C: 83-76; D: 75-68; E: 67-60, FX: less than 60 %. After completing the course, the student acquires the competence to use and apply specific provisions of regulations and directives of the European Parliament and the Council of the EU in various areas of environmental regulation.
