Conditions for passing the course:			
Method of evaluation: Completion by a continuing assessment			
Continuous evaluation: The condition for completing the course is the submission of a specialized/scientific work (the scope is at least 3000 words (10 standard pages)), for which the supervisor will make an opponent's report. The course attendance is evaluated via a general evaluation - assessment of a manuscript of a specialized / scientific work prepared by a student for a specific partial legal problem usually related to the topic of the dissertation thesis. Such a work can demonstrate the student's individual ability to think analytically and synthetically and interpret legal institute(s) in sectoral, inter-sectoral and cross-sectoral contexts. The student is able to formulate their own scientific hypotheses and conclusions. The condition for granting the evaluation is the submission of the manuscript of a professional / scientific work ready for the publication, which must be proven by a relevant confirmation. Evaluation scale: 100% - 93% - A; 92% - 85% - B; 84% - 77% - C; 76% - 68% - D; 67% - 60% - E; less than 60% - FX.

Learning outcomes: By completing the course student: - deepen the ability to ask meaningful research questions; - deepen the ability to formulate scientific hypotheses; - deepen the ability to think conceptually (especially to create a suitable structure of a scientific text); - deepen the ability to search for relevant and current scientific sources; - deepen the ability to use appropriate stylistics when writing a scientific text			
Schedule of subject: From the content point of view, the syllabus is linked to the topic of professional/scientific work, which is determined by the student after consultation with the teacher and which usually relates to the topic of his dissertation. From a formal point of view, the syllabus is linked to a sequence of steps, the completion of which leads to the achievement of a specified result - to the writing of a professional/scientific work in the range of at least 3000 words (10 standard pages). The basic task of the teacher is to provide the student with professional advice, especially with regard to the appropriate formulation of the research question, appropriate formulation of scientific hypothesis, overall text concept, recency and relevance of used scientific sources, consistency of used terminology, suitability of stylistics, etc. The teacher tries to guide the student with the aim that the work can be published later.			
Recommended reading: The student defines the literature by himself depending on the theme of his/her work. The teacher's role is to ensure that the student uses current and relevant literature and he also supervises, in particular that the student does not omit key reference literature in the relevant field of knowledge.
