Learning outcomes:

This course will introduce students to the theories and frameworks of healthcare organisation and financing. The methodology employed in this course will provide students with theoretical knowledge and practical skills enabling them to understand the principles of health insurance in the Slovak Republic and their practical implications. The case studies and debates employed during the lecture will enable students to formulate solutions for presented problems including proposals de lege ferenda. These will be confronted with reforms prepared within the Component 11 and 12 of the Slovak Recovery and Resilience Plan. Acquired knowledge might be used in preparation and application of legislation in the fields of healthcare and health insurance as well as for solving of everyday legal issues regarding healthcare.

Schedule of subject:

1. Healthcare systems and policies.
2. Organisation and financing of healthcare in the Slovak Republic, health insurance.
3. Healthcare reimbursement, categorisation of medicines and medical devices, access to innovations.
4. Categorisation of the inpatient care – Recovery and Resilience Plan.
5. Challenges of the future – gene and cell therapies, innovative payment models.
