Method of evaluation: Completion by a continuing assessment					
Continuous evaluation: The course ends with an ongoing evaluation in the form of a written presentation prepared by a doctoral student on a specific issue of criminalistics, through which the student demonstrates the his / her ability to think creatively and analyze partial problems and issues in the field of criminalistics. At the same time, the doctoral student demonstrates the ability to connect criminalistic aspects with criminal procedural law aspects, while he / she will be able to evaluate the selected problem from both of these points of view.

Learning outcomes: By completing the course the student will gain: - orientation in current issues of criminological science, - ability to identify criminal contexts of the topic of his dissertation, - deepening the ability to think analytically.					
Schedule of subject: The course focuses on those topics that are most discussed in the current forensic literature. In the introduction, the lecturer introduces the essence of the selected problem, presents the basic doctrinal positions and identifies arguments. Subsequently, in dialogue with students, he will look for connections between the presented problem and the topics of their dissertations. Basic thematic areas: - forensic characteristics and its elements, - forensic traces and identification, - methodology of cybercrime investigation.
