It includes: an individual study of research papers and textbooks, reading selected works, completing tasks in Moodle, filling in the self-diagnostic online tests, and studying for the final exam. Typically, there is one assignment for each week of the semester. The student will not be allowed to sit the final exam if their portfolio is incomplete or contains mistakes. Final evaluation: The final exam has the form of a written test (students with special educational needs may ask for the oral test). Evaluation Scale: 100 – 85% – A 84 – 80% – B 79 – 75% – C 74 – 70% – D 69 – 60% – E 59% and less - F

Learning outcomes: Students are well-versed in the main areas of literary theory (the theory of literary and aesthetic communication, the theory of verse, the poetics of the poetic and prose text, the basics of narratology, etc.). They are also able to identify the key poetic features of a fiction text, to identify the functions of compositional elements in the structure of a text and to apply literary theoretical knowledge during interpretational reading of a fiction text. Assumed educational outcome is not only the literary theoretical training, but also the formation and enhancement of students' reading competence.
